We are here to listen - PE Uniform

After much campaigning from the school council and listening to the views of the children at Blakehill and their parents, we have decided that **from**September, children will come to school in their PE kit on the days that they have PE.

This kit will be a **PE uniform** and there will be <u>strict expectations</u> that it is worn as such. The only logo on the uniform should be the school logo. The Blakehill uniform consist of:

A navy blue school jumper/hoody (with or without school logo) Black/navy blue jogging bottoms/leggings

Navy blue shorts

White T shirt

Black pumps or black trainers

We feel the benefits of adopting a PE uniform would be:

- Limited changing times therefore increasing actual physical activity times
- A reduction in lost property items
- Abolish the constraint of changing room facilities in the school building

All uniform items are available from the usual uniform outlets including The Uniform Shop (Bradford) and Whitakers (Shipley). The new hoodies with the school logo will be in stock from the above shortly.
