Polite Reminders

Our school handbook states that jewellery, make up and nail varnish should not be worn in school by our children and those pupils with pierced ears are allowed to wear studs only. Watches can be worn and consideration is given to jewellery pertaining to religious and cultural beliefs.

For your child's safety, the school gates are locked at 9:00am and reopen at 3:00pm. Entrance to school can be accessed via the main entrance on Highfield Road.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones are not encouraged to be brought to school by pupils. In exceptional circumstances there may be no alternative, but they **must be switched off** on entering the school grounds and then handed to the class support staff for safe keeping during the day. Pupils must not use them inside the school grounds.

School Attendance 2015-2016

Last year, pupil attendance was **95.4%** which is slightly below the **96%** national average. Thank you to parents for ensuring that their child's/ren's attendance is consistently good throughout the year. School is well aware that holidays are cheaper during term time however we do urge that children are not taken on holiday during these times as











attendance can affect a child's attainment and progress. All requests for holidays will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Attendance will be continued to be monitored throughout the school. Well done – keep up the hard work everyone!

Parking

Can we politely remind parents about considerate parking during dropping off and collection times. Complaints from local residents with regards to parking across driveways and parents not adhering to road markings have been received by school. Parking is monitored regularly by the local PCSO Mr Turner Blood. Thank you

School Uniform

Blue and white checked school dress
Navy blue sweatshirt/cardigan with school logo
Black shoes – **not trainers or high heels**Boots can be worn for outside but shoes/pumps must be worn in school
Black/white socks or black tights
