50 Years of Blakehill Primary School

What a fabulous day we have had celebrating 50 years of the opening of Blakehill Primary School. Opened in January 1975 as a First School, Blakehill replaced Thorpe First school after its closure in November 1974.

Consisting of only 5 classes and 140 children, we have grown so much over the last 50 years to a much larger Primary School with 60 staff and 420 children on roll.

Today the children learned a little bit more about what our school was like when it first opened and what life was like back in 1975. We celebrated with a whole school assembly, a Reception and KS1 parade, music and dance from children in KS2 and a throwback festival on the field this afternoon.

Even the kitchen staff were involved with a typical 1970's school dinner menu.

A time capsule filled with memorabilia from 2025 will be buried in the school grounds for future generations to uncover.
