Thank you to all parents who attended our Spring Term Parent and Teacher Consultation evenings last week. As always, these were very well attended and provide an opportunity for parents to discuss their child's progress, attainment, attitudes to school and classroom behaviours with the class teacher.

Schools are required to provide at least one opportunity per year for parents to discuss their child's progress with a teacher.

At Blakehill, we always provide **two** consultations per year (Autumn and Spring terms) as we acknowledge how valuable these are to parents. In addition to these face-to- face meetings, parents receive pupil **mid-term reports** and an annual **end of year report** in which a more detailed and holistic account of your child in school is provided.

At any time throughout the year, we encourage parents to make an appointment with their child's class teacher if they require further information or have any concerns.

The outcome of the 253 parent questionnaires received is attached to this newsletter. The responses reflect the high regard that parents continue to have of our school. Thank you.
