Partial Closures due to COVID-19

This half term, pupils and staff in two classes have needed to selfisolate as a result of two separate positive test results for coronavirus. Our response to this has been helped significantly by the support from the families affected by the closures of these bubbles.

To ensure that bubble closures have minimum impact on childrens' learning, the school's remote learning policy is implemented, allowing children to access their learning from home, using the Google Classroom platform. School's **Remote Learning Policy** is on our school website.

The feedback we receive from parents is invaluable and helps us to continue to shape our remote learning package to suit the needs of our school community.

We have a number of Chromebooks available for families who have limited access to digital resources. Please contact the school office if you require further information.

It is vital that school is notified as soon as possible if a child or someone in your household develops symptoms. This allows us to consult with Public Health England and the Department for Education and act swiftly to implement the measures necessary to minimise the risk of infection spread.
