#### School Council

Our school council, made up of pupil representatives from all classes from year 1 to year 6, meet every two weeks and discuss a range of topics with a focus on making school better for our children. In all classrooms suggestion boxes and worry boxes allow children the opportunity to offer suggestions/concerns as a class or as an individual. These are then brought to the meeting and form the basis of some of the discussions and ideas that the school council raise. These ideas are fed back to staff by Mrs. Hall and Miss Gardner at staff meetings.

This week, school council discussed ways in which school could reward pupils who achieve 100% attendance on a short term basis. The children came up with the idea of holding a weekly raffle whereby the names of every child who attends school all week are put into a bag and selected at random. The winner receives a voucher/token for that week. The names are renewed every week, giving all children who attend school regularly, the chance to receive a prize. This idea has been successfully pitched to school leaders and the new reward system, aimed at improving incentives for 100% attendance will be introduced during the first week back after the half term. Well done school council!

#### Letters to parents

We are aware that lots of information is given to parents by school and we are trying to reduce the amount of paper copied letters parents receive. Wherever possible, school will send letters to parents via email unless we require a consent form to be returned. We are also trying to share information through the school website and on notice boards in and around school in an attempt to improve communication.

### Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday this week, Mr. Lowe and Miss Lea led an assembly which raised the children's awareness of being safe on the internet and what to do if they see or hear something that upsets, worries or concerns them. Some classes in Key Stage 2 have already been visited by PSCO Luke Carson this week who has talked to children about safety on the internet and the effects of cyberbullying. After the holidays, he will continue to work with staff and pupils, providing information linked to raising the profile of safety on the internet.

Last week, our year 2 classes visited the Chocolate Story in York. They had a wonderful day learning how chocolate is made and returned to school with bags full of goodies including 'lickable wallpaper!' Our year 3 children visited Bradford Cathedral last week. The visit consolidated the work the children have been doing in their Religious Education lessons and provided them with a deeper understanding of Christian places of

worship and some of the customs and practices of the faith. Today our year 6 pupils are at Danelaw, learning first-hand what it would have been like for the Viking settlers during the first century.
