Medication

Remote Learning

In the event of a local lockdown requiring pupils to remain at home, or classes, groups or individual pupils needing to self- isolate, schools are required to provide access to immediate remote education by the end of September.

Blakehill's contingency plan for remote education will be shared with parents during the next couple of weeks. This will involve access to high quality online and offline resources that are linked to our school's curriculum expectations. Resources will be used consistently across school and will be adapted wherever possible to meet the needs of our pupils.

Staff will help pupils to familiarise themselves with the resources and parents will be provided with all the information they should need to support their child's home learning.

Naturally, we are hoping that we are not faced with further school closures however; we want to be as prepared as possible for this eventuality.

Year 6 Secondary School Applications

Safeguarding

Could parents please notify school if the usual arrangements for collecting your child at the end of the school day changes. In the interest of your child's safety, staff particularly in KS1 will not allow a child to go with an unknown adult unless notification is been received.

School Uniform

The children look really smart in their school uniforms, particularly those pupils in KS2 who are now wearing a school tie. So far, (touch wood) these seem to have caused very little distraction! We have received so many complimentary comments from staff and parents about the appearance of our pupils in school.

Children are encouraged to come to school in their PE Kits on the days that they have PE. Wherever possible, PE lessons are outdoors so an outdoor kit is advisable. If you have any problems sourcing clothes for PE, please let Mrs Bottomley, the school Learning Mentor, know.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name. This makes it easier when trying to locate lost property.

Parking

Could we remind parents to park with consideration when dropping off/ collecting children at the beginning and end of the school day. School has already received complaints from local residents, raising concerns about parents parking across driveways. We realise that parking availability is not ideal around the school premises however; we ask that you put our children's safety first and respect the property of the local community. Our local PCSO has been alerted to these concerns.
