Parent comments are really useful in helping school leaders meet the needs of our families. As a school team we aim to work with our families to ensure that we provide the best possible start to your child's education as possible.

Homework

There is always an ongoing debate about homework, with parents stating that there is too much, too little, just right and this year was no exception. As educators, we understand that homework at early primary level is not particularly effective unless it is directly linked to classroom work. At Blakehill homework tasks focus on reading, spelling and number. Project based learning tasks are set each term and pupils in years 5 and 6 receive age appropriate activities in preparation for their secondary education. Parents that attended the meetings this week will have received information of how they can help their child at home and useful links to additional resources are on our school website.

Communication

School have varied ways of communicating with our parents to ensure that all families can access information more readily. Newsletters, Marvellous Me, Facebook, Twitter, email and letters are all used by school staff to relay information.

The effectiveness of everyone's communication has been limited by the lack of opportunity we have had during the last two years, to meet in person. Staff are planning various events and activities that will provide opportunities for parent to be more involved in their child's learning at school.

Parent/Teacher Consultation Evenings Whilst many of our parents could see the benefits of virtual meetings, your feedback on the whole indicated a preference towards the return of face-to-face meetings. Teachers commented that the lack of in person meetings affect relationship building that we pride ourselves on at Blakehill. The Parent/Teacher Consultations in March will be face-to-face. Parents can book appointments from Monday 28th February on the School cloud platform. Please contact the school office for support if necessary. Please note: Due to both class teachers being in the last stages of pregnancy, Parent Evenings for 5J and 4J will remain virtual in March.

Persistent Absenteeism

If attendance falls below 90%, this is classed as persistent absenteeism 65 pupils at Blakehill are identified as persistent absentees. The majority of these have valid reasons for their poor attendance e.g. COVID, long-term illness etc. It is a parent's responsibility to ensure that their child attends school as regularly as possible and schools are legally obliged to monitor and address poor attendance. It is our job to help to support you and prevent long term persistent absenteeism resulting in prosecution. Parents will be kept informed of their child's attendance regularly should this become a cause for concern.
