Let It Snow...

Although beautiful and fun to play in, the onset of the snowy weather usually brings disruption to travel arrangements for all of us. We always aim to inform staff and parents as early as possible of school's opening plans, to allow them to make the necessary arrangements. This can only be done once the site team arrive at school and assess the conditions of the premises and the main/side roads.

Thank you to Blakehill staff and families for responding quickly and efficiently to the most recent wintery weather, which meant that we could get to school safely.

Parent/Teacher Consultation Evenings

I will be sending a questionnaire to parents after the Christmas break to ask for feedback on the organisation and effectiveness of the recent parent and teacher consultation evenings.

Staff feedback was very positive and recognised that waiting times between appointments was significantly reduced for parents. The structure of the meetings enabled a focused and informative conversation around children's learning in the usual 10-minute allocated time slot. We are aware that some meetings needed to be slightly longer due to the specific learning needs of individual pupils. This will be taken into account during our Spring Term consultation meetings.

<u>Snacks</u>

There still appears to be some confusion about the snacks children are allowed to bring to school to eat at break time. Children in Reception classes, year 1 and year 2 are provided with free fruit daily. Children in Year 3 - Year 6 can bring fruit or cereal bars to eat. Crisps and chocolate bars are not permitted. This has always been our school practice and shared with parents via the school prospectus and newsletters. Parents recognise the important role that schools play in encouraging pupils to make healthy life choices, which include healthy food choices. Educating children at an early stage in their lives helps them to make considered choices and benefits them in the future. Thank you.

Much to Celebrate

Every year, an Education Advisor visits schools in Bradford from the Local Authority. Our advisor visited Blakehill last week. We toured the school, visiting all classrooms and learning areas, popped into lessons, met with some of the children and staff and even managed to squeeze in a couple of playtimes. We had a great time discussing the school's journey, aims, values and school culture during the visit. We know that we have a fabulous school and take great pride in the outcomes that our pupils achieve. We constantly strive to provide our pupils with the very best quality of education. It was great to see that the advisor thought the same and recognised the achievements of our school.

I wanted to share with you some of the comments made in the report following the advisor's visit:

- The most recent nationally accredited data in 2019 is extremely impressive. Pupils at all ages exceeded national averages. Year 6 leavers' attainment and progress were particularly strong.
- Creative subjects are highly valued along with other areas of the curriculum
- Reading and the love of reading were praised in the last inspection report. School has continued to give reading and phonics a very high profile in the last 2 years. Reading, the teaching of phonics and SMART reading in Key Stage 1 are strengths.
- Early Years is a strength along with the whole school quality of teaching and learning.
- The consistency of approach is a major strength of school. This was noticeable on the learning walk during this visit.
- The team ethic, which was praised in 2019, is even stronger in 2021.
- The Headteacher demonstrates extremely strong leadership and has built very strong leadership capacity through a team model.
- School is very clear in its focus on evidence-based approaches with a strong track record.
- The curriculum is broad and balanced. There is a strong and engaging range of learning opportunities including many wider learning opportunities.
- School collaborates well with others and is outward facing. Staff show a strong commitment to sharing their practice and expertise with colleagues in other schools.
