### **School Behaviour Procedures**

From January, school staff have been implementing our revised behaviour policy and procedures. We decided to adopt three school rules that embraced the views of our pupils, parents, staff and governors. These are:

- Be Ready
- Be Respectful
- Be Safe

These are known by all children and staff at Blakehill and are used to remind children of school's high expectations of pupil behaviours.

The main aim of the new policy is to provide a clear and consistent approach to managing pupil behaviours whilst helping pupils to understand that there are clear and measured consequences to poor behaviour choices.

Incidents of inappropriate language and behaviours are recorded. This allows us to monitor individual pupils and identify patterns in pupil behaviour.

We want pupils to leave Blakehill with the skills, knowledge and attitudes that will help them to be successful in later life.

### Holiday Dates 2020/21

To try to accommodate parents who wish to take their children on holiday during the Spring Bank break 2021, school leaders and governors have decided to extend the Spring Bank holiday from the usual one week to two next year.
