To Be or Not to Be Mrs Hall and Mrs Rashid have organised two days of Shakespeare for the whole school. All children will be involved in Shakespearean drama, music and literacy workshops during the last week of half term.

Our most recent pupil survey revealed that a significant number of children at Blakehill are finding it difficult to get to sleep or are waking up in the middle of night. Speaking to the children, it became clear that many were using their devices late into the night. Recent research from UNICEF revealed that using devices at night can interfere with children's sleep quality, which in turn can affect how a child feels and responds the following day. UNICEF recommend limiting the use of phones, tablets and computers for at least 30 minutes before bed and to think twice about letting your child use these devices in his or her bedroom after lights out. Keeping Children Safe

At the end of the school day, children in Reception - Year 4 are escorted out of the school building by a staff member and handed over to a visible and known adult.

Some of our older pupils have permission to walk home. Staff members supervise the external gates at the beginning and end of the school day.

Children are told that if their adult is not here to collect them, they must not leave the school premises. Parents and carers should inform staff in the school office if collection arrangements change or if they are running late to allow us to inform your class teacher/ make alternate arrangements.

School finishes at 3:15pm and children should be collected promptly.



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
