#### Year 6 Secondary School Applications

It is that time of year again when our Year 6 parents receive information about applying for a place at secondary school for their child. If parents have any questions or concerns, please contact a member of the Year 6 teaching team who will be able to help you.

#### **School Uniform**

How smart do our pupils look in their school uniforms, particularly those pupils in KS2 who are now wearing a school tie? So far, (touch wood) these seem to have caused very little distraction! We have received so many compliments from staff and parents about the appearance of our pupils in school.

<u>Please note</u>: There is no requirement for any of item to have the school logo displayed as we understand the cost implication to families that are linked to branded clothing. We still have many items of preloved uniform in school. These have been donated by parents and are free of charge should you require anything. Please contact the school office if you require any items of uniform.

A pump bag is required for pupils in Reception to Year 4. Rucksacks can be brought to school for pupils in Years 5 and 6, although a pump bag is more desirable due to the congestion caused in the limited space in these cloakrooms.

Each class has PE twice a week: one indoor session and one outdoor session. PE kits should be in school on the days that your child has PE. A full list of uniform requirements is on the school website. PLEASE ENSURE ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING etc. ARE NAMED. This helps us to return items quickly and easily if misplaced.

#### <u>Snacks</u>

Children in Reception classes, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with free fruit daily. Children in Year 3 - Year 6 can bring fruit, vegetables or cereal bars to eat. Crisps, sweets and chocolate bars are not permitted. The school tuck shop, available to children in Years 3-6 sell healthy snacks at break time. The cost of each item is 20p. We recognise the important role that schools play in encouraging pupils to make healthy life choices which include healthy food choices. Educating children at an early stage in their lives helps them to make considered choices and benefits them in the future. Thank you.

#### Medication

All medication, including inhalers were returned home wherever possible at the end of term in July. If your child requires medication in school, could you please make sure that this is handed in to staff in the school office. Parents need also check expiry dates on prescribed medication. Thank you! Media and Photography Consent Form Unless we have parent/carer written consent, we are unable to use images/photos of your child on our school newsletters, website, Facebook etc. If you have not already done so, please complete and sign the school's Media and Photography Consent Form which can be obtained from the school office. Parents wanting their child to be exempt must also indicate their wishes.

#### Extra- Curricular Clubs

We are incredibly proud of the range of extra-curricular activities offered at Blakehill. We are always looking for ways to extend opportunities for the children in school to participate in a rich and diverse offer of enrichment activities.

After school clubs start from Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September. Look out for letters home about clubs in school and speak to Mr Lumb, the school's Sports and Personal Development Officer for further information or if you have new ideas.

### Safeguarding

Could parents please notify school if the usual arrangements for collecting your child at the end of the school day changes. In the interest of your child's safety, staff particularly in KS1 will not allow a child to go with an unknown adult unless notification has been received.



#### Parking

After a year-long campaign by our school council, Bradford Council introduced speed calming measures on Highfield Road during the summer. There are plans in the pipeline to introduce additional road markings to promote safe parking in and around school. With the return to a whole school start and end time to the school day comes the frustration caused by limited parking availability.

Inconsiderate and unsafe parking is an ongoing cause for concern among residents and parents/carers and school are often asked to intervene, particularly when conversations become heated.

This, unfortunately is a problem that we all have to manage in the best way we can. Our main priority is the safety of our children and their families.

The stretch of Highfield Road outside of the school gates is particularly hazardous, and the absence of a crossing patrol person increases the risk potential.

Please park with care and consideration. A few minutes' walk is better than an early morning altercation in the presence of children.

#### **Safeguarding**

School is responsible for the safe handover of every child to a responsible adult at the end of the school day. We are also responsible for ensuring that older children, walking home unsupervised, are safe and that there is a responsible adult at home when they arrive.

To help us to keep your child safe, please notify your child's class teacher in writing if your child walks home alone.

If there are factors that may impact on the safety of any child, school will ask to speak with parents/carers.

#### Mobile phones and Smart watches

Devices that can take photos or record, including Smart watches, are not allowed in school. Pupil mobile phones should be switched off once on the school premises and handed over to the class teacher for safe keeping.

#### **Contact Telephone Numbers**

Could you please ensure that our office staff are notified if you have changed address, email or telephone number? Having the correct contact details of parents/carers, (e.g. current mobile and telephone numbers) are vital when children are ill and immediate contact needs to be made.

#### SEND Parent/ Carer Meetings

Do you have a child with additional needs? Do you feel unsupported, alone, at a loss of who to speak to or where to go for help? Do you just need other people to talk with and share experiences and ideas with? YOU ARE NOT ALONE.

It is our ambition that parents of all children, including children with additional needs, are fully supported and involved in their child's education.

Mrs Gould (SENDCO) works closely with SEND agencies to organise meetings in school aimed at providing information, a support network, advice and a chance to speak to lead professionals in a safe and supportive environment

#### Parental Involvement

# Attendance - making every day count!

#### Making every day count!

100% attendance at school is extremely important in helping all pupils achieve their full academic potential. We recognise that good attendance and punctuality are crucial to raising standards and pupil attainment. Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning.

During our weekly celebration assembly the highest attending class of the week receives a £5 voucher to spend or save. All children that have 100% attendance that week are entered into a weekly prize draw.

#### Fixed Penalty Notices

Holidays taken during term time are subject to a fixed penalty notice as part of the Local Authority campaign to improve attendance across the district. Schools do not benefit from any fines - this is paid directly to the council however Local Authority schools like ours are obliged to follow the guidance and procedures.
